"It is hard to feel engaged online. I miss the in-person stuff – I feel more connected to people when I am sitting next to them"

"I miss seeing the same people at meetings. With online meetings I feel like there are always different people in the room."

"Attending online is better than nothing and is our reality right now. But if I could attend meetings in person, I would."

"I don't have a car so attending online is much easier for me. I usually have to find a ride to the meeting."

"COVID has made me feel even more isolated. The last thing I needed was to have in person meetings cancelled."
